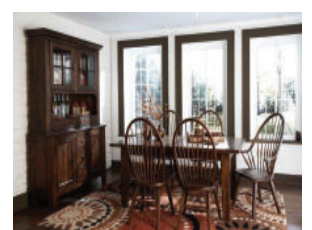
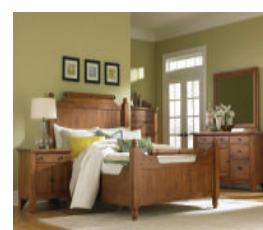

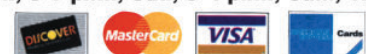

Gap Church holds annual hymn sing

At the Gap Church, four miles west of Albany, blue-grass hymns could be heard as the Old Fashioned Gap Church Hymn Sing on the afternoon of Sunday, Aug. 20. For the third year, the band Grass

Attack led the hymns. Bourbon Junction accompanied them. Both bands tour in the area. The music began with "I'll Fly Away" and finished with "Amazing Grace" with a bit of special music by the bands in the middle. People hailed from as far away as Madison

to sing. An open house accompanied the hymn sing and old records and photos were on display. The church was built in 1856, "It started in the early '90's to keep the building up," said Jane Copus, hymn sing organizer. A goodwill offering served this purpose. The funds will be used to rebuilt the front doors of the church.

Albany Carp fishing contest set for Labor Day weekend

There's a bounty out for those nasty varmints robbing the Sugar River of its natural game fish.

Once again this year the Lake Winnetka/Sugar River Improvement Association Inc. will hold its annual Carp Fishing Contest on Labor Day weekend, Friday, Sept. 1 through Labor Day, Monday, Sept. 4, in Albany, Wis. The event will be held rain or shine.

There will be a 50 dollar 1st-place prize for the most carp caught and another 50 dollar prize for the Largest Carp caught. Win both, get 100 dollars.

2nd place through 5th place prizes of cash or merchandise will be awarded to the remaining 4 contestants with the most carp caught, regardless of size.

There will be two fishing pole prizes for contestants under 10 years old.

No registration is required to

compete in the contest, but you must have a valid Wisconsin fishing license. Carp may be caught by pole and/or bow fishing.

Qualifying carp must be caught from the Sugar River in Albany or on the millpond (Lake Winnetka) upstream of the Albany Dam. Hint: the shallow, muddy areas of the lake are where many carp hide out.

The goal of the contest is to provide a fun way to help game fish proliferate more abundantly by removing as many carp as possible.

You may start fishing anytime on Friday Sept. 1, and fish all weekend. The contest ends at 1 p.m. on Labor Day, Monday, Sept. 4.

Prizes will be awarded rain or shine in the park by the Albany boat ramp.

Parkview Viking volleyball will field young team in 2017

The Parkview Vikings volleyball squad is hoping for a bounce back year in 2017. The Vikings will be an inexperienced team as Parkview has just five returning varsity players.

Parkview went 6-19 overall while posting a 3-7 Rock Valley conference record last year. The Vikings lost three Second-Team All-Conference members and a Honorable Mention player from the 2016 team. Reagan Watts, Bailey Kloepfer and Becca Smith were named to second team All-Conference. Abby Harnack received Honorable Mention recognition.

The Vikings' goals remain high entering 2017. Coach Kelsey Smith is careful to take things a step at a time. Smith wants the Vikings to get better every single day and compete

every time they step on the court.

The Vikings return three key players that played significant minutes last fall. Senior outside hitter Amber Hudson will lead the Vikings' offensive attack. Hudson racked up 35 kills a year ago.

Junior middle hitter Madison Felmeten returns for Parkview. Felmeten has taken major strides during the offseason as she played club volleyball. Smith has noticed those improvements during the first few official practices last week.

Felmeten expects to provide a big block and be a key offensive weapon that Smith can count on.

The third returning starter is senior setter/right side hitter Chloe Marquis. Marquis will be making a position switch this year moving from setter to the right side. Smith will rely on Marquis leadership while learning

a new position to fill a team need. Smith believes that Marquis can become a potent hitter on the outside.

The strength for the 2017 team will be the Vikings hitters. Smith firmly believes that if the Vikings can pass well, and give these dangerous hitters a chance to swing then good things will happen.

The area that the Vikings struggled in last year was "serve-receive." Smith has made that a priority in early practices last week. Some other areas that Smith wants to see improvement in is serving and passing.

Parkview returns five letter winners this year including Marquis, Felmeten, junior libero Erin Schoen, Hudson and senior Emma Hoscheit.

The Vikings will join the Trailways south division this fall. One challenge this presents Smith is she isn't familiar with the teams. Smith also mentioned that the Vikings don't have a history with these teams like they did the Rock Valley south teams especially Brodhead.

Smith stated that the Brodhead matchups were always fun and the players will miss that rivalry.

The Albany Comets volleyball team looks to take steps forward in 2017 after a tough 2016 season. The Comets went 0-20 overall and 0-8 in Six Rivers east play.

Head Coach Eric Ebensperger enters his second year leading the volleyball program. Before taking over the Albany program, Ebensperger had a successful tenure as head coach at Brodhead. He also was an assistant at Division 1 powerhouse Westosha Central.

The goal for this year's squad is to continue to get better. Ebensperger hopes to see growth individually and as a team throughout the season. Another goal for the Comets is to get a match win.

Ebensperger knows the importance of fundamentals and will stress that every day to every single player. In any turnaround learning the fundamentals is a key first step in that process.

Albany returns four starters in 2017. The returning starters include junior setter Sydney Bloedel, senior middle hitter/blocker Haley Freitag, junior middle hitter/blocker Libby Beck and senior libero Hailey Stefanik. This group of players will look to make positive strides from a cultural standpoint.

Albany returns seven letter winners in 2017. Some newcomers junior Sydney Mortaloni and senior Paige Blumer could make contributions for the Comets.

The Comets will need to improve their defense in 2017. Argyle enters the year as the preseason conference favorite.

One area that Ebensperger believes will be particularly strong is the middles. Freitag and Beck will be relied on heavily to put up big offensive numbers and lead the offensive charge in 2017.

Pastor's Corner

Fools for Christ

When Martin Luther began the Protestant Reformation nearly 500 years ago, he compared his work as a reformer to that of a court jester.

In 1520, he wrote to the German nobility and emperor asking for them to take up the work of reform. He said to these powerful leaders, "I shall for the time being become a court jester." And he compared the hat he wore as a monk to a jester's cap with bells. Why would Luther pick such a foolish image for himself?

Luther knew that fools have power to speak truth when others wouldn't dare. He goes on to say, "More than once a fool has spoken wisely, and wise men have often been arrant fools." A court jester could openly mock the powerful under the guise of foolishness when others would be too afraid. Luther was known to use his sense of humor to challenge and expose the powerful.

Furthermore, Luther recalled the words of the Apostle Paul, "If you think that you are wise in this age, you should become fools so that you may become wise. For the wisdom of this world is foolishness with God" (1 Corinthians 3:18-19). Luther knew that to be a disciple of Christ is to become a fool by the world's standards.

The problem is that our world has everything upside-down, and the cross of Jesus is God's verdict on our upside-down ways. Our world worships wealth, but Jesus died in poverty. Our world worships power, but Jesus died in weakness.

Our world worships victory, but to die on a cross is a humiliation. "But," writes Paul, "God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong" (1 Corinthians 1:27). Jesus redefines wisdom and greatness for us.

This is why I worry when Christians adopt worldly standards of success and when we become focused on aligning ourselves with the rich and powerful. Not only does this cheapen the gospel of Jesus Christ, but it takes much of the fun and joy out of being a Christian.

A couple of weeks ago I wrote about the Holy Humor of the Christian life. This week I want to lift up the freedom and joy that comes when we trade the weary wisdom of the world for the foolishness of the crucified Messiah. After we let go of the world's standards, we can create all kinds of mischief.

There are several examples of this from church history. For example, Simeon the Holy Fool from 6th century Russia was known for throwing nuts at priests in the cathedral as they preached. And even though he was known for being weird, he was also known as a holy man who cared for the sick and poor in secret.

Likewise, the 16th century Russian Saint Basil the Blessed was known for walking around Moscow wearing nothing but a very long beard and other eccentricities. And yet Basil was the only man that Tsar Ivan the Terrible feared, because of Basil's holiness.

In one story, Basil marched into the Tsar's palace to force him to eat raw meat during the Lenten fast. Basil said to Ivan, "Why abstain from eating meat when you murder men?" No one besides this holy fool would have dared to confront the Tsar in this way. And to this day the cathedral in Moscow's Red Square is named after Basil the Blessed.

Like Paul, Simeon, Basil, and Luther, we are called to be fools for Christ. We too can create holy mischief in our upside-down world and be court jesters in the halls of the powerful. May we find joy and freedom in the path of discipleship.

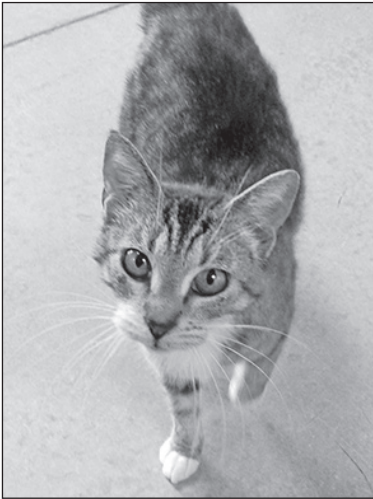

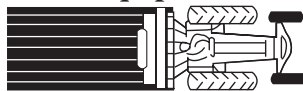
