# New rule lets Veterans exchange military CDL for commercial CDL

WISCONSIN DVA NEWS RELEASE

Active duty and recently discharged members of the United States Armed Forces may now use the training and experience they received during their military career to obtain a Wisconsin commercial driver license (CDL).

Wisconsin DMV put this process in place for returning active duty personnel after recent changes to Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration rules.

The training provided to Military CDL holders, and the testing they undergo to become licensed, is as good

or better than that currently required by federal law. Wisconsin DMV now waives CDL knowledge tests (in addition to the current skills test waivers and fee waivers for commercial licenses) for certain classes and endorsements of commercial motor vehicles.

This "even exchange" of a military CDL to a Wisconsin CDL is similar to the seamless exchange for a driver moving to Wisconsin from another state.

## Military knowledge and skills test waiver "Even Exchange" program

If you have been regularly employed in a qualifying Military Occupation Specialty (MOS) and have a military license issued by any military facility that allows you to operate a military commercial vehicle, there is the possibility that you can use it to evenly exchange for a Wisconsin CDL.

This process allows you to obtain a CDL by waiving the knowledge testing and skills testing requirements due to your experience and training with these vehicles in the military.

To qualify for the "Even Ex-

change" program the following applies:

You must provide evidence and verification on form MV3588 by your commanding officer that you have been regularly employed within the last year in one of the following specified Military Occupational Specialties (MOS):

- US Army- 88M, 92F, or 14T
- US Air Force- 2T1, 2F0, or 3E2
- US Marine Corps- 3531
- US Navy- EO

You must be a Wisconsin resident to be eligible for this waiver.

This waiver does not cover the Hazardous Materials or School Bus Endorsements.

This waiver is ONLY available to current and former (within one year after separation/retirement) members of the military service, including Reserve and National Guard units.

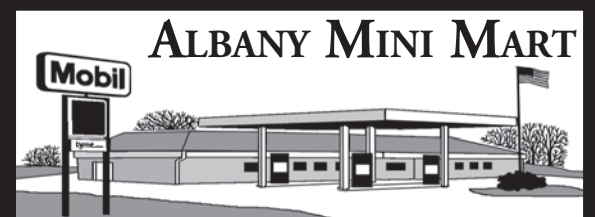

Juda placed first in this year's Division 4 Tri-State Math Meet at the University of Wisconsin, Platteville on Nov. 7.

Nearly 800 students from over 60 high schools in Southwestern Wisconsin, Eastern Iowa, and Northwestern Illinois (the tri-state area) participated in this contest. Juda was one of the smallest schools but had over half its

high school compete with 65 students participating.

When you ask Scott Anderson, the high school math teacher at Juda, about the Juda Math team, he is quick to point out that "this is a big deal. We have an awesome group of students, over 60 of them, who work hard at math and put their best effort into the competition. Beyond using our own problem solving skills, we also have to function as a team, which is a fun aspect of the event."

Four schools from the Six River's East competed: Albany, Juda, Monticello and Pectaonica. In Division 4 Juda took first, Albany second and a tie for third between River Ridge, Ill. and Mineral Point.

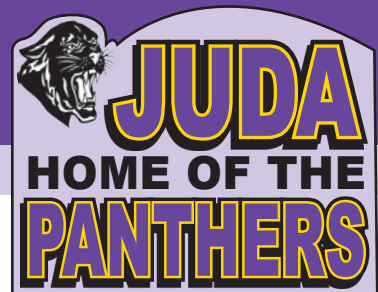

# State milk production dips for just third time since 2014

WISCONSIN AG CONNECTION RELEASE  
For only the third time in the past four years, Wisconsin dairy cows failed to produce more milk during the month of October than they did a year earlier. According to the USDA's monthly milk production report, state output totaled 2.54 billion pounds last month, down 0.3 percent from October

2017, but more than September's 2.51 billion pounds (which had less days on the calendar).

Prior to this, year-to-year production has risen 50 of the past 52 months in Wisconsin, according to records kept by Wisconsin Ag Connection. Only May of 2017 and April 2018 showed a dip in the trend.

Nationally, 16.9 billion pounds of milk was produced in the 23 major dairy states for the month, which was 1.0 percent more than in 2017, but less than the previous month's 16.4 billion.

California continues to have the highest total production with about 3.36 billion pounds. Colorado had the greatest increase in year-to-year output as that state produced 391 million pounds of milk in October, up 10.1 percent from the same period last year.

Meanwhile, the number of milk cows on farms in the 23 major states was 8.72 million head, 8,000 head less than October 2017, and 1,000 head less than September 2018. The average number of milk cows on Wisconsin farms for the month was 1.27 million head, unchanged from last month, but 4,000 head less than last year. Monthly production per cow averaged 1,995 pounds, which is about the same as last year's figures.
