Multiple departments dispatched to house fire in Hanover

 For some residents in Hanover, it was just another night. However, around 8 p.m., a fire was spreading through a quiet house in the 8400 block of Front Street.
 A disabled woman was the lone occupant of the house at the time. Korey Statton, a nearby neighbor, who heard her yelling for help, rescued her. The woman was in a wheelchair and could not escape through the doorway of the home. She was able to call 911 before trying to leave the home. She was taken to the hospital for injuries unknown.

Multiple departments responded to the 3rd box alarm including Orfordville, Footville, Beloit, Brodhead, Juda, Monroe, Albany, Brooklyn, Evansville, Oregon, Milton and Stoughton. Upon Orfordville's arrival, it was reported that one side of the house was fully engulfed.
 Green County EMS was also paged out to the scene.
 Two adults and four children live in the house. The children and their mother were not home at the time of the fire.
 The cause of the fire and name of the family are not yet known at the time of this publication.

Foodborne Illness Advisory: Del Monte recalls canned Fiesta Corn

WISCONSIN DATCP RELEASE

The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection is advising consumers of a food recall for Del Monte canned fiesta corn seasoned with red and green peppers. Del Monte issued the recall on Dec. 11 due to under-processing of this product. This means the product did not complete the sterilization process so there is the potential for Clostridium botulinum bacteria to grow.

This bacteria creates toxins which can cause botulism – a life-threatening foodborne illness.

The Rock County Land Conservation Department is taking orders for its yearly Tree and Shrub Sale.


Inventory of trees and shrubs is limited so order early for best selection. Trees and shrubs come in single species units of 10 for \$20, bundles of 25 for \$27.50 or 50 for \$50 plus tax. All seedlings are bare root.

Trees come in the following sizes: 18-24” Black Walnut, Pin Oak, Red Oak, Sugar Maple, and White Oak; 7-15” Canaan Fir, Colorado Blue Spruce, Norway Spruce, White Pine, and White

Spruce; and 12-16” Cook’s Balsam Fir.

Shrubs are 18-24” American Plum, Nannyberry, and Sargent Crabapple. Tree protectors (4-foot-tall) are available again this year and also Root Dip Planting Gel.

All plants will be ready for pick-up around mid-April. Invasive snail found in two new streams

SOUTHWEST BADGER RESOURCE CONSERVATION & DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL

New Zealand mudsnails, an invasive snail, have recently been verified in two new streams in Dane County. The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources is asking anglers to help prevent the spread of this organism to other water bodies. Brewery Creek is a tributary to Black Earth Creek and is located in Cross Plains. The furthest upstream-verified sites were roughly 0.6 miles upstream from the confluence with Black Earth Creek. New Zealand mudsnails were first confirmed in Black Earth Creek in the fall of 2013. Oregon Branch of Badfish Creek is located just East

of Oregon. This site is the first confirmed infestation of the mudsnail in the Rock River Watershed.

These findings now make six known inland streams with populations of these invasive snails. All six streams are in either Dane or Columbia counties.

The New Zealand mudsnail is an NR40 prohibited invasive species, meaning that this species has the potential to cause harm to the environment, human health, or the economy.

The small snail can outcompete native stream insects that serve as food for fish, possibly depriving some fish of their preferred food. However, it is uncertain what impacts this invasive species will have on Wisconsin

streams.

All water users play an important role in preventing the spread of the New Zealand mudsnail. Anyone can help prevent the spread of invasive species by following the Stop Aquatic Hitchhikers guidance of:

- **INSPECT** your equipment, which includes boots, waders, nets, fishing gear, boat live wells, boat hulls, and trailers
- **REMOVE** any attached aquatic plants or animals from equipment
- **DRAIN** all water from boats and

equipment; and

• **NEVER MOVE** live fish away from a water body.

Due to the tiny size, "stickiness" to boots and other surfaces, and their ability to survive out of water for a long time, special precautions need to be taken to prevent transferring the mudsnail to new waters. Therefore, people who wade streams for any reason are strongly encouraged to use a brush to scrub their boots and waders to prevent transporting New Zealand mudsnails.

Boot brushes are sometimes available for use at kiosks at popular trout fishing access points. Equipment can also be thoroughly rinsed with tap water after scrubbing but only away from any streams or water bodies. Freezing gear for at least eight hours will also further reduce the risk of transporting New Zealand mudsnails to other streams.

By using these prevention strategies, water users can help protect our fisheries and stop the spread of invasive species.

Participating inmates receive a dose of an injectable medication before their release that treats opioid use disorder. A treatment plan after release that includes counseling and follow-up injections provided in the community is established to ensure success.

The total amount awarded is \$1,326,040. This funding is available through June 30, 2019. The contracts may be extended. Up to \$750,000 of funding is available in future state fiscal years.

The funding for this grant program is part of 2017 Wisconsin Act 261 (link is external), one of 30 bills authored by state Representative John Nygren and signed by Governor Scott Walker since 2014 as part of the Heroin, Opioid, Prevention, and Education (HOPE) Agenda to address Wisconsin's opioid crisis.
