





### Nutrition education program changes to meet needs of new audiences

A successful nutrition education program is getting a new name to make it relevant and accessible to more audiences.

FoodWIse, formerly known as the Wisconsin Nutrition Education Program, or WNEP, has a long legacy of providing nutrition education to Wisconsin families and individuals with limited incomes. While the program remains strong, much has changed at the national, state, and local level since it first began.

"We wanted to move away from an acronym that holds little meaning for program partners and our target audience," Amber Canto, the state coordinator for the program, said. "Our goal was to move closer to an action-oriented name that reflects our purpose and intended outcomes, as well as focus on a relevant digital presence.'

FoodWIse, University of Wisconsin-Extension's nutrition education program, is a federally funded

effort that seeks to empower Wisconsin residents with limited incomes to make healthy choices to achieve healthy lives and reduce health disparities. Program funders include the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program-Education (SNAP-Ed) and the Expanded Food and Nutrition Education Program

In 2016, FoodWIse worked in 66 of 72 Wisconsin counties. FoodWIse employs a combination of tested educational strategies designed to help people choose healthy foods and active lifestyles.

FoodWIse nutrition educators work out of county Cooperative Extension offices and in collaboration with state and local partners.



### Panthers win state semi-final

The Juda-Albany Panthers' (26-2 overall, 14-1 Six Rivers) lethal lineup displayed their countless offensive weapons under the lights on the grandest stage in a 13-4 victory over Phillips in a WIAA Division 4 State semifinal game at Goodman Diamond. This will mark the softball program's first ever state championship game appearance.

"It hasn't sunk in yet. It's such a great thing," coach Bill Davis said. T'm so happy for the kids, but it just hasn't hit us yet that we're able to play for a state championship. You get to the game and you hit the ball well, and anything can happen."

"I never thought coming into high school that I would be going into a state championship game my senior year. I don't think it will ever sink in," senior Alexis Goecks said.

"It's unbelievable. There are no words to describe it. It still hasn't settled in. That's been our goal all year --1-0 -- and when we go by that motto, there's nothing we can't do," junior Hailey Kammerer said.

Goecks opened the game with a bang as she drilled a loud triple into right center. Senior Sara Jordan put down a bunt to the left of the mound a fly ball into left field that junior Madfor a base hit. Jordan took the extra 60 feet when Phillips starter Morgan Edwards looked Goecks back at third and relaxed.

"It's nice to come into a state game and have that one big play to start the game and get your team going," Goecks said.

"She was great just bringing the energy and getting on base and setting the tone for the rest of the team," Kammer-

"Alexis starting off with that triple, and then getting a bunt down to put a little pressure on them was huge," Davis said.

Senior Sayde McDermott lined a clutch two-run base hit into centerfield to give the Panthers the early momentum and get the already pumped-up Panthers fans to their feet. Edwards retired the next two Panthers on a lineout and flyout to escape further damage.

"McDermott's approach was what we talked about: hit strikes and swing at strikes," Davis said. "You're going to have more success if you swing at strikes and lay off the pitches outside the zone. That sounds simple, but it's not always that simple when you've got all that pressure on you and the crowd and everything. I thought the kids handled that very well."

"My approach was to get on base. I had my bat, my secret weapon. I found my secret weapon over this past week and I got up there and I'm like, 'I got this.' She doesn't pitch anything that I haven't seen before, so let's get it done," McDermott said.

The state defensive jitters showed in the bottom of the first as the Panthers committed two errors. Edwards lifted

die Roth misjudged for a two-base error. Ashley Kilty then moved Edwards to third with a productive groundout to second. Lorren Sauter pulled a chopper to Panthers' third baseman Mc-Dermott, who didn't field the grounder cleanly, allowing Edwards to race home. Juda-Albany starter junior Nicki Becker recorded consecutive strikeouts to limit the damage. The Panthers returned to their stellar defense after the first inning as everybody contributed over the final six frames.


When asked about the Panthers' defensive miscues in the first inning Da-

Edwards kept the Panthers' bats in check over the next three innings. She retired nine out of ten Panthers with two strikeouts.

Becker was just as dominant over that stretch as she faced the minimum, including three strikeouts. Juda-Albany turned a key double play in the third inning. Edwards popped out a bunt to Becker, who fired to first to double off the runner. Becker got huge mileage out of her nasty rise ball in the early

Goecks displayed her bat skills with a picture-perfect bunt to the right of the mound, just past Edwards. Senior Chelsea Burkhalter worked a lengthy at-bat that resulted in a walk to load the bases. Edwards uncorked a wild pitch to make the score 3-1. Jordan drilled an RBI base hit to centerfield to extend

The Panthers' patience continued as McDermott drew a walk to load the bases. Becker took Edwards's first offering into deep centerfield for a sacrifice fly. Kammerer drilled an opposite-field RBI single into left field to plate Jordan. On the ply, the ball got by left fielder Brook Bogdanovic and rolled to the fence to allow a second run to cross home plate. Junior Sammi Detra capped the six-run outburst with an RBI base hit into centerfield.

"We knew that in order to keep in the game, we had to stay aggressive. We needed to get a few runs in every inning, and just keeping that mentality of getting runs really helped," Kammerer said.

"Our team has been known all season -- when we see a pitcher the second time, we hit the ball a lot better. We hit the ball actually pretty well the first time through the lineup tonight," Davis said. "We were putting the ball in play quite a bit, so it was just a matter of getting the middle of it a little bit more. So later in the game, we saw more pitches and saw what she was doing. We had good approaches and hit the ball really good.'

The Loggers answered with two runs

in the bottom half of the inning. After retiring the first two Loggers quickly, it looked like Becker was going to have a quick inning, but Phillips had a different idea. Megan Polster connected on an opposite-field single into right center, and nine-hole hitter Mikayla Kosmer received a rare free pass. Edwards then lifted a fly ball into shallow left field that Goecks tried to make an over-the-shoulder basket catch on, but the softball found the grass to plate the Loggers' second run. Kilty smoked an RBI base hit into centerfield to cut the Panthers' lead to 8-3. Becker retired Sauter on a popout to second to end the

The Loggers' momentum was quickly erased as the Panthers responded with two crucial runs in the top of the sixth. Burkhalter laced a single to centerfield. Jordan followed with a second straight single right back up the middle. Centerfielder Sauter's relay throw was off the mark and went out of play, allowing Burkhalter to come around to

Moments later, Edwards unleashed a wild pitch. Juda-Albany capitalized on all five Loggers errors.

"They're not a bad team, and good teams come back. So you always have to be on your toes, but just making that statement: we're still here to play,'

"Phillips had a little bit of momentum built up there, and who knows what kind of offense they can produce if we don't answer back. We kind of put a little halt to their momentum." Davis said.

The Panthers tacked on three runs in the top of the seventh. Kammerer tattooed a base hit into centerfield and advanced 60 feet on a well-executed sacrifice bunt by Detra. After junior Haley Freitag drew a walk, Adkins clubbed an RBI single into left field. A second run came home on another Loggers' error. Goecks closed out the Panthers' scoring with an RBI groundout to first.





# Drinking water testing available An exciting opportunity to learn about the Special bottles are required for these tests, and County UW-Extension Office, Victoria Solomon, Bottles must be filled and returned on Monday

An exciting opportunity to learn about the water you drink is being offered to all residents with private wells in the Towns of Albany, Brooklyn, Mt. Pleasant, and New Glarus. Others in the county may also take advantage of the opportunity to test their drinking water.

If you are interested in learning more about drinking water and the quality of your water, this program is an opportunity to have your well water tested at a reduced cost and learn of the results during an educational program with drinking water experts. Groundwater specialists strongly encourage rural residents to test their water at least once every two years.

This program is neither mandatory nor regulatory. It is completely voluntary. Those who participate will receive the results of their water tests during an educational program the evening of August 1. Results will be kept confidential. Special bottles are required for these tests, and there is a cost for this testing. You may choose one or more of the testing packages described below.

- Homeowner Package (includes tests for nitrate, coliform bacteria, pH, alkalinity, and hardness). The cost is \$49.
- Metals Package (tests for arsenic, lead, copper, iron, zinc, calcium, magnesium, manganese, sodium, potassium, and sulfate). The cost is \$49.
  Triazine Screen (includes tests for triazine
- type pesticides like atrazine). The cost is \$27.

  If you choose all three packages, the cost is

\$117, a discount of \$8.

Bottles must be filled and returned on Monday, June 26, to the site where you picked up your bottles. Tests must be paid for when the bottles are picked up.

Results will be available the evening of Aug. I during a free, 90-minute educational seminar. Everyone will have the opportunity to ask questions, and results will be kept confidential. If there are problems with your water (for example, bacteria or high nitrate levels are detected), you will be notified by mail within two weeks of your sample date. If you are unable to attend this program to obtain your complete results, they will be mailed to you.
