Individuals and groups honored for work to control invasive species

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) congratulated the winners of the 2023 Invasive Species Council Invader Crusader Awards on

The Wisconsin Invasive Species Council selects the Invader Crusader award winners as part of Invasive Species Action Month in June. The governor-appointed council advises the DNR and the state legislature on invasive species issues.

Each year, the council honors Invader Crusaders, individuals, groups or organizations who have made significant contributions to prevent, monitor or control invasive species that can harm Wisconsin's ecosystems, economy and, in some cases, public health.

Nominations come from residents and organizations, and awards are given in several categories. 2023 Invader Crusader Award winners and the organizations they volunteer or work for are listed below.

Jim Giffin: Jim has made a lasting impact on Lake Minnesuing, a 432-acre lake with 6.6 miles of shoreline in Douglas County. He has secured 12 different grants to fund invasive species control efforts on the

lake and garnered cooperation from neighboring landowners and organizations. He has brought together a community around the lake to promote invasive species control and monitoring, as well as native landscaping and restoration.

Nancy Gloe: For over two decades, Nancy has reared and distributed Purple Loosestrife biocontrol beetles to great effect. She has eradicated this species at one site and documented substantial reductions in her new work area along the Glacier Drumlin Trail at Scuppernong Creek. Her enthusiasm and experience have made her a knowledgeable teacher and

Richard "Dick" Ballou: As founder of the Cedar Lake Buckthorn Project in Barron County, Dick has spent the last 15 years securing grants, organizing workshops, and spreading the word on how and why controlling buckthorn is important. 



The evening will also feature a marker's market of local, Black-owned businesses including Jamaican Fair Trade Coffee, Emmanuel's Mix, and Cottonmouth MKE.

This event will take place during the opening reception of the Craft Beer Professionals CBP Connects conference being held this year in Milwaukee June 19 to 21. Held in a different city each year, the CBP Connect conference brings together brewery owners, taproom managers, brewers and craft beer industry professionals for educational sessions and networking opportunities. The opening reception will take place at MobCraft Beer on Monday, June 19 from 7 to 10 p.m.

Andrew Coplon of Craft Beer Professionals states, "We are extremely excited to be hosting our event in Milwaukee! Craft Beer Professionals from across the country will be uniting for the opportunity to learn and grow stronger together." Coplon continues, "To celebrate Juneteenth, our partners at Lifting Lucy and MobCraft have organized a vendor market at our welcome reception at the MobCraft taproom. We are excited for our attendees to meet new businesses while being able to support the wonderful causes of Lifting Lucy and MKE Black.

Funkytown Brewery will be the beer focus of the welcome reception with two draft beers available during the event. The brewery was founded in 2021 by childhood friends Richard Bloomfield, Zachary Day and Gregory Williams in their hometown of Chicago, IL. In November 2022, they partnered with the Pilot Project at 1128 N. 9th Street in Milwaukee, a taproom that serves as a launch pad for start-up breweries. Currently, Pilot Project Milwaukee offers five beers from Funkytown Brewery on

underrepresented communities within the beer industry."

A portion of the taproom proceeds will benefit Lifting Lucy, a Nashville, TN based organization that focuses on empowering underrepresented communities within the brewing industry, particularly Black, Indigenous, and other women of color (BIWOC). Their mission is to break down barriers and promote progress for BIWOC in beer by partnering with philanthropists, breweries, nonprofits

and other stakeholders. 'We are immensely proud to join forces with MobCraft Beer, Craft Beer Professionals, Funkytown, and MKE Black for this Juneteenth event," says Tranice Watts of Lifting Lucy, "Collaborating with these exceptional partners allows us to showcase our mission of empowering Black, Indigenous, and all Women of Color in the brewing industry. Their unwavering commitment to producing high-quality craft beer while making a positive impact in the community perfectly aligns with our vision. Through this partnership, we can amplify our efforts, create more opportunities, and continue leading the way towards a more inclusive and equitable future in the world of beer."

Proceeds also go to benefit MKE Black, a non-profit dedicated to raising awareness and supporting Black owned businesses in the greater Milwaukee area. MobCraft has partnered with MKE Black several times in the past, including the Lager and Listen series, a regular open panel discussion designed to elevate the voice of people of color within various industries in Milwaukee. Each Lager and Listen series was moderated by Henry Schwartz, President and CEO of MobCraft, along with Ayrton Bryan of MKE Black and featured a rotating series of prominent leaders of color in Milwaukee.

MobCraft and Jamacian Fair Trade Coffee also partnered on the creation of Black is Beautiful Stout, a concept beer created by Marcus Founder of Weathered Souls Brewing and brewed by over 1,100 breweries across the world. MKE Black was also a collaborator in and beneficiary of MobCraft's original Black is Beautiful
