Paws by the River event to help Humane Society

City of Janesville, Humane Society of Southern Wisconsin aim to reduce shortfall

On Saturday, Sept. 23, the City of Janesville and the Humane Society of Southern Wisconsin will introduce Paws by the River, a dog walk and community event at Traxler Park to benefit local homeless pets. This joint fundraising endeavor will help bridge the gap of the city's budget shortfall in 2023.

The walk begins at 9 a.m. and leashed, well-behaved dogs are welcome. Dog walk participation is \$25 per adult and \$15 for kids ages 6 to 17 and includes a goodie bag and admission to the family fun day.

Participating dogs must be licensed and have proof of rabies vaccine (if over four months of age), distemper vaccine, and Bordetella (kennel cough) vaccine.

The family fun day begins at 10 a.m. and will feature city of Janesville vehicles in touch-a-truck fashion, K-9 demonstrations, meet and greets with Janesville Jets

players and mascot, games, food trucks, and an HSSW tent with merchandise for sale and the Duck Pluck cash raffle. Tickets for the family fun day only are \$10 for adults and \$5 for kids.

The winner of the summerlong Duck Pluck will also be drawn during the

event. Ducks are \$5 each or three for \$10, and are currently available at the Humane Society of Southern Wisconsin or by contacting Shannon at sredden@petsgohome.org.

Village of Footville changes parking regulations

The village of Footville sent out a notice on Thursday, Sept. 7 regarding changes to Footville municipal code relating to parking regulations. Copies of the ordinance will be posted in three places in Footville: 261 N. Gilbert St., 212 Depot St., and 509 S. Gilbert St. The ordinance number is No. 2023-06.

The Village Board of Footville, along with Village President Steve Haberman, states that when official traffic signs and/or official yellow curb markings are placed so as to give notice thereof, no person shall park a vehicle on any of the following streets, at the locations indicated, at any time:

- A Street, on the east and

west side, between West Centre St. and Bly St.

- Depot Street, on the east side, between Janesville Place and Galena Road.
- Galena Road, on the south side, between Depot St. and South Gilbert St.
- Janesville Place, on the north side, between Gilbert St. and Depot St.

- Janesville Street, on the north side, between South Gilbert St. and the east boundary line of Edward St. (two bus lengths from corner, timed for pickup).
- Janesville Street, on the south side, between Gilbert St. and Church St.
- North Gilbert Street, on the east side, opposite the village

fire station property

- North Gilbert Street, on the west side, between North St. and Galena Road.
- North Street, on the south side, across from the Footville Community Park.
- Park Street, on the east side, the entire length.

On Sept. 7, the Village Board of Footville, along with Village President Steve Haberman, also announced that they are making changes to the time of

their meetings. The ordinance number is No. 2023-05, which states that regular meetings of the Village Board shall be held on the first Thursday of each calendar month at 6 p.m. Any regular meeting falling on a legal holiday shall be held the next following Thursday at the same hour and place. Copies of the ordinance will also be posted in the same places as the changes to the parking regulations.

Rock County's annual tree and shrub sale on now

The Rock County Land Conservation Department is now taking orders for its yearly tree and shrub sale. Distribution is usually around mid-April 2024.

The trees and shrubs offered are bare root seedlings in single species units of 10 for \$25 (only shrubs can be split into bundles of 10), bundles of 25 for \$35, or 50 for \$60 - all plus tax.

- Silky Dogwood, 12-24 inch seedlings

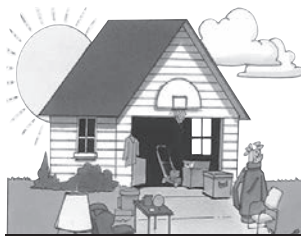
