## 200 students join in FFA land, soil contest

Nearly 200 students from 27 Wisconsin high schools competed in the Wisconsin FFA State Soil and Land Evaluation Competition on Tuesday, Oct. 10, at Blackhawk Technical College's Monroe Campus in partnership with the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Natural Resources Conservation Service. High school students were tested on their knowledge of soil composition, conservation practices and soil limitations. Teams were ranked in two divisions – junior and senior. Junior team winners were from Fennimore, with Cassville and Potosi coming in second and third. In the senior division, the top three teams were Monticello in first, Potosi in second, and River Ridge in third. Blackhawk also will host the 2024 competition.

## Orfordville Lions Club hosts lighted trail walk

## UWW announces student teachers for fall 2023 semester

A total of 143 students from the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater will serve as student teachers for the fall 2023 semester. Student teaching is the final activity before teacher candidates earn their degree and license.

Students from the university's College of Education and Professional Studies will serve as student teachers through January 2024.

"Our students are highly sought after," said Fred Trotter, administrative director in UW-Whitewater's Office of Clinical Experiences. "School districts really appreciate the caliber of our graduates."

Students were placed in school districts around the state starting in August. Student teaching is the final activity before teacher candidates earn their degree and license.

UW-Whitewater will partner with 210 cooperating teachers across 134 schools in 87 districts over the course of the semester.

"We couldn't do this without a lot of the great partnerships we have with those pre-K through 12 schools – their partnerships are very much appreciated,"

Trotter said.

Student teachers assist cooperating teachers with lesson planning, instruction and assessment. Some student teachers are pre-selected by UWW staff and cooperating schools for internships, earning a small stipend and teaching up to 50 percent of their day as a certified teacher would.

# Give blood this fall at these donation sites

Since announcing a national blood and platelet shortage a month ago, thousands of donors across the country have rolled up a sleeve to help rebuild the American Red Cross blood and platelet supply.

As that generosity continues, the Red Cross is working around-the-clock to ensure patients have access to lifesaving transfusions and must collect 10,000 additional blood and platelet donations – over and above expectations – each week over the next month to sufficiently meet hospital needs. Donors of all blood types are urged to book a time to give now, especially those with type O blood or those giving platelets.

To make an appointment, use the Red Cross Blood Donor App, visit RedCrossBlood.org or call 1-800-RED CROSS.

To encourage more blood and platelet donations, the Red Cross is offering new incentives to donors over the next month. All who come to give Oct. 21 to Nov. 9 will receive a \$10 gift card by email to a restaurant merchant of their

choice. They'll also be automatically entered to win a \$5,000 gift card. There will be three lucky winners – one chosen at random each week.

As cold and flu season quickly approaches, the Red Cross is reminding donors that they can still give blood or platelets after receiving a flu vaccine, so long as they are feeling healthy and well on the day of their donation. Likewise, there is no deferral or wait time for those receiving the updated COVID-19 vaccine.

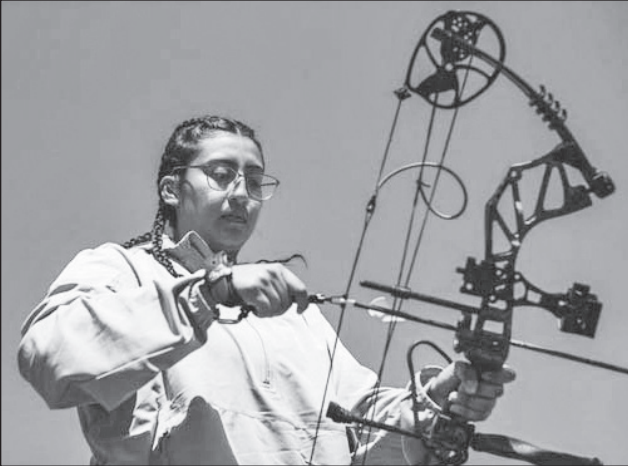

# Archery, shooting programs connect new audiences

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) encourages the public to try out programs and opportunities offered in Wisconsin that provide experience shooting firearms and archery equipment.

The DNR owns 11 public shooting ranges statewide and works with partners to provide public access to more ranges through the Shooting Range Grant Program. In Wisconsin, shooting sports programs are also available and include the National Archery in the Schools Program, Scholastic 3D Archery, Scholastic Clay Target Program and the USA High School Clay Target League.

Participation in shooting sports and archery programs can help people gain experience with handling guns and bows, firearm safety, shooting range etiquette and target prac-

tice. These activities are a great way to spend time with family and friends, while keeping skills sharp for the hunting season.

The DNR works with partners such as Pheasants Forever, Becoming an Outdoors Woman, Pass It On Outdoor Mentors and Raised at Full Draw to introduce new audiences to hunting and the shooting sports. By offering programs for beginners, such as Women's Wingshooting Nights and BOW's Introduction to Shooting Sports, new hunters are able to get started in a safe and supportive atmosphere.

To get started, take a hunter education course, participate in a shooting sports workshop or Learn To Hunt class in your area or simply visit a local DNR public shooting range or a private range.

# Pheasant season now open in Wisconsin

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) reminds hunters that the state's 2023 pheasant season already opened this October and will run through Sunday, Jan. 7, 2024.

Pheasant hunters need a valid small game license and a 2023 Pheasant Stamp, which can be purchased through the Go Wild website or at a license sales location.

The daily bag limit is two roosters per day. This limit will remain in place for the remainder of the season. Hunters may harvest a rooster or hen when hunting in designated hen and rooster hunting areas; see page 18 of the hunting regulations for a list of these areas.

Several pheasant hunting properties close at noon on weekdays from now through Nov. 3. Hunters are encouraged to double-check the legal shooting hours on the properties they intend to hunt and consult the DNR's hunting rules and regulations before going out.

The DNR plans to stock approximately 75,000 pheasants from the state game farm on over 80 properties statewide. Depending on production levels, pheasants are released

once before the pheasant hunting season and twice a week for the first two to three weeks of the season. After that, birds are released about once a week until the nine-day gun deer season opens on Nov. 18.

Hunters can use the DNR's Fields and Forest Lands Interactive Gamebird Hunting Tool (FFLIGHT) to locate

properties stocked with game farm pheasants. FFLIGHT allows hunters to use aerial maps, topography and measuring tools to identify areas of interest and make their trips more productive and enjoyable.

Due to changing habitat conditions, Cadiz Springs State Recreation Area and Liberty Creek Wildlife Area, both

in Green County, will not have pheasants released this season. Hunters can visit the DNR's Pheasant Stocking Information webpage to check the status of a specific property.

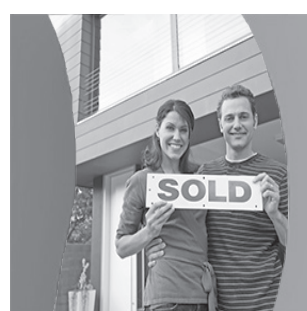
